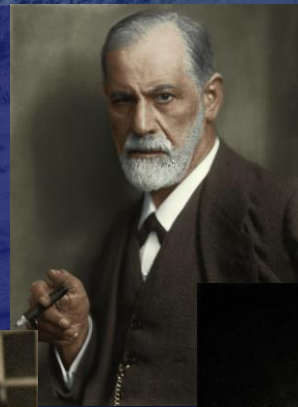
**Tasks.**

- To study the concept of legal psychology, its methods and principles, to consider the history of the development of this science.

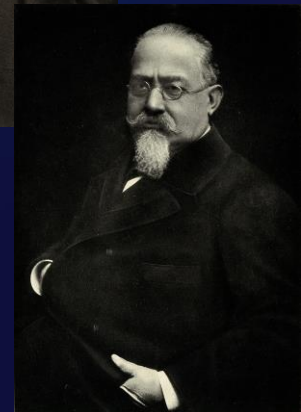
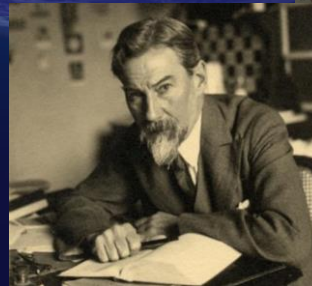
**Goal.**

- To find out the relevance of legal psychology among law students.

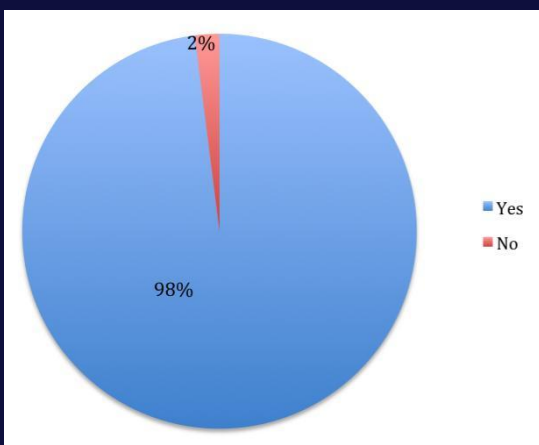
